Robi Ben-Haim Robi Ben-Haim (; born 6 January 1952) is an Israeli actor, comedian, writer, director, and voice actor. He acted in a number of Israeli films and television shows, and starred in the 2001–2005 TV series *Krokodil*.

Ben-Haim's stage roles and films have won him many awards and nominations, including two Ophir Awards.

Biography **Early life** Ben-Haim was born in Kiryat Shmuel, Israel, on 6 January 1952. His father was a violinist, and his mother a chorister. As a child, he attended the National Theatre School of Israel. He served in the Israel Defense Forces' Talpiot Givatai Band. **Career** Ben-Haim's acting debut was in 1973's *Efrem Machzor*, in which he played the role of Yisrael, opposite the cast of *Room and Board*. In 1984, he debuted in the Israeli theater scene with the play "Ela, Shlomo, Meshuta." In 1997, Ben-Haim played the role of "Adan the Barber" in the popular Israeli television show *Baitayt Halev* (That Night in the Cemetery), which was later released to home video. Ben-Haim has also acted in dozens of films and television programs, including in 1982's *Innocents of the Night*, in 1989's *The Great Leap*, in

1995's *Cast a Giant Shadow*, and in 1994's *The City of the Century*. His film roles include 1997's *Bara'as shel Shmuel*, the 1998 film *That's How I Imagine It*, and the 2003 film *Trois frères*. In 2001, Ben-Haim played the role of Yoram Shmulevich in *The Great Seabird Conspiracy*. Two years later, he played the role of Dvora Rabin in the Israeli film *Naomi and Elya*. In 2005, Ben-Haim acted in a number of TV series, including *Krokodil*, *Or*, and the 2005–2006 sitcom *Fast Company*. In 2008, he was the director and screenwriter of the play "Shalom, Shabbes" and "Kibbutz"... and was the actor in "Tikva".
